
Going to Dubbo Regional Theatre and Convention Centre

Convention Centre.




There are sliding doors going into the foyer.



When you get to the theatre, you might need to collect your tickets from the Box Office. You might need to wait in a line. You will hear background music played in the foyer.



Before the show starts, you might need to wait in the foyer. The foyer is where you wait with your family, friends or teacher until the performance starts.



While you are waiting you might need to go to the bathroom.



If you want a snack or a drink before the show you can go to the snack and drink bar with your family. You can take your bottle of water with a lid into the theatre, but other drinks and snacks are not allowed.




You will hear the sound of bells in the foyer. This means the doors to the theatre are now open. If your seats are upstairs you can take the staircase or use the elevator.





The Dubbo Regional Theatre has 4 different doors to enter the theatre. They are called Door 1, Door 2, Door 3 and Door 4. They have big numbers to tell you which door to enter through.



When it is time to go into the Theatre an usher will meet you at the door and tell you where your seat is.



Inside the theatre there are red seats.




When the show starts it will be time to be quiet and listen. The lights will turn down a little bit.



The show will happen on the stage. Real people will come onto the stage to tell you a story. These people are the actors who are pretending to be the characters in the show. They may be dressed up in costumes.



Sometimes the performance will be loud. Sometimes it will be quiet. Sometimes there will be many different lights with bright colours that might flash. If you need to look away or cover your ears you can.



At the end of the show people will clap their hands to say thank you to the performers. You can clap your hands too, or if it is too loud you can cover your ears with your hands.



When the performance is finished you will leave Dubbo Regional Theatre.

You will leave through the sliding doors again.
